Applying the patch



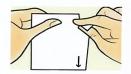






Step 1

Select the area where OXYTROL® will be applied: abdomen, hip or buttock. Make sure skin is clean and dry.



Step 2

Carefully tear open the pouch and remove the OXYTROL® patch.



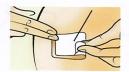
Step 3

Turn over and peel off half of the protective liner. Try not to touch the adhesive.



Step 4

Press the patch firmly on the skin, adhesive side down.



Step 5

Carefully remove the remaining half of the protective liner.



Step 6

Smooth the patch over your skin and press firmly. Wash your hands thoroughly.



The OXYTROL® patch should be changed on the same two days every week (eg. every Monday and Thursday) to maintain its beneficial effect.

Removing the patch

Remove old patches slowly and carefully to avoid skin damage. Once off, fold the patch in half for disposal. Warm water and mild soap can be used to remove the 'ring' of adhesive that may remain on the skin. A small amount of baby oil may also be used to remove any excess adhesive. Alcohol or similar liquids may cause skin irritatation and should not be used.

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Additional Information

To help keep the site of application healthy and irritation free;

- You can apply baby oil to the area, allow to dry and then apply the patch
- Rotate the site of application
- Remove any residual gum when removing patch
- If irritation and redness, apply 'over the counter' hydrocortisone cream to the area regularly for 5 days

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
